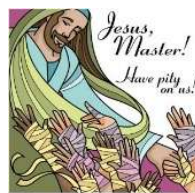

OCTOBER is the month of the Holy Rosary.

"The Rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer. In the sobriety of its elements, it has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety. With the Rosary, the Christian people sits at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love. Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer." St. John Paul II
The Rosary is a Christ-centred prayer. It is an immersion in the joyful, luminous, sorrowful and glorious mysteries of His life as retold in the Gospel and the Scriptures. St Bernard said: It is right to meditate on these truths of the life of Christ, and I thought it right to recall the abundant sweetness given by the fruits of this priestly root. By meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, we are able to draw near to Mary and with her to recall the mysteries of our redemption. The Rosary is thus a powerful weapon in the spiritual warfare that every Christian must in some way face.

Pope Leo encourages Catholics throughout the world to pray the Rosary every day during October to invoke God's gift of peace, **We have Rosary and Exposition before each weekday Mass.**

OCTOBER is also the month of Missio. Missio Scotland is the Holy Father's official charity for overseas mission and is part of a global network serving the church in over 120 countries. Their mission is to share God's word in the remote areas of the world where the church is young or poor.
