ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL

MSPs have voted by 70 votes to 56 in support of the Scottish assisted suicide Bill at Stage One.

This means that the Bill will now proceed on to Stage Two. However, a number of MSPs made it clear that they were only voting through the Bill to continue the debate around this Bill and would not necessarily support the Bill at the final vote at Stage Three.

This means that this Bill can still be defeated

Right to Life are going to redouble their efforts to ensure that the Bill is fought at every stage and ensure that it is defeated to protect the most vulnerable.
